Some neighbors have expressed concern that the Ridgewood Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's) are not being followed by everyone. Our CC&R's, which are legally binding, are posted on our webpage (www.ridgewoodsonora.org) or you may request a copy by emailing (preferred) or calling any one of us on the Board. The Board's contact information is in this newsletter and posted on our website. Please pay particular attention to the CC&R sections pertaining to landscaping, architectural changes, lighting, fencing, and vehicle restrictions (including RV's, trailers, and commercial vehicles) as these seem to be the areas of most concern for neighbors. Unlike a Homeowners Association with costly mandatory fees which may be used to take legal action to enforce CC&R's, the Ridgewood Neighborhood Association is not mandatory and the \$10 voluntary dues are used to cover miscellaneous costs such as meeting hall rental, post office box rental, mailing, copying, Website and paper supplies. Those serving on the RNA Board volunteer their time. Homeowners are encouraged to communicate with their neighbor(s) when they have concerns about CC&R non-compliance issues. Hopefully, good neighbors will abide by the CC&R's, respect their neighbors' concerns and come to amicable

resolutions of issues. Ridgewood is one of the nicest neighborhoods in Sonora and we hope to keep it that way.

I look forward to seeing you at the January 28 general membership meeting. Until then...Happy Holidays!
